#### MANDATE LETTER - THE RELIGIOUS DIMENSION OF HUMAN LEARNING

The inter-relatedness of human knowledge means that all Learning Areas explicitly or implicitly teach about God and religious values and questions. Hence, Catholic schools need to help students to reflect critically on the contribution religious understanding can make within each Learning area.

Sunday's Gospel has a most important lesson for us about God's law. Laws are very important. Laws protect people. They tell us, for example, that we may not drive at a dangerous speed. But laws do not just tell us what we may not do. They also point out the things that are good and important. When we understand the meaning of laws, we are more able to follow family rules, school rules and the laws of our country. We are more able to follow the law of God. We can also begin to understand today's reading.

Listen to the words of the Holy Gospel according to Matthew 22:35-40

An expert in the Jewish Law tried to test Jesus by asking, "Teacher, what is the most important commandment in the Law? Jesus answered, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, and mind,' this is the first and most important commandment. The second most important commandment is like this one. And it is, 'Love others as much as you love yourself.' All the Law of Moses and the Books of the Prophets are based on these two commandments."

Main Roads will be undertaking essential maintenance and improvement work on the two Maritana Street Bridges, commencing Monday 4 September.


During work, one bridge will be closed with traffic diverted on to the second bridge (see detour map below).
