It is hoped that this earlier testing period will enable schools to have the data available in a timely manner to drive and inform their teaching programs.

A reminder that we have our first Pupil Free day on Tuesday 7th March. The Staff will be working with consultants from Catholic Education WA (CEWA) in the learning area of Mathematics.

Please read the notes carefully, so you are well informed about the day. These special days take a lot of organising and as always, we rely on parent help to make it run efficiently. This week, we will be sending home to all families a link to a survey to complete. The survey is called the Tell Them From Me (TTFM) Survey. We will be surveying our older students, school staff and families. We use information we are provided with to inform and plan our improvement agenda.

MANDATE LETTER - NEW EVANGELISATION IN OUR SCHOOL

The truths of the Apostles' Creed need to be presented in the context of the human search for God and for meaning. The sacraments need to be presented as works of Christ, whose 'effects' of 'fruits' are meant to be experiences of the divine power of the Kingdom of God in Daily life.

The Life in Christ needs to be presented as the Christ-like Christians are empowered to live through the seven Sacraments and Christian Prayer. The Lord's Prayer needs to be presented as the model for prayer for anyone who shares in Christ's relationship with God.

Last Sunday's Gospel story was about the tests that Jesus had to face from the devil while he fasted in the desert. This Sunday we have a very different story. It's about Jesus taking three of his special friends up to the top of a mountain to pray. While he prays, the way he looks begins to change. He seems filled with wonderful light. This is called Transfiguration, because Jesus' body or figure becomes bright with glory.

Jesus shows his glory to the three-apostles to give them the courage and strength they need to follow him.

GOSPEL

Listen to the words of the Holy Gospel according to Matthew – 17:1-8

Jesus took Peter and the brothers James and John with him. They went up on a very high mountain where they could be alone. There in front of the disciples, Jesus was completely changed. His face was shining like the sun, and his clothes became white as light.

All at once Moses and Elijah were there talking with Jesus. So, Peter said to him, "Lord, it is good for us to be here! Let us make three shelters, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah."

While Peter was still speaking, the shadow of a bright cloud passed over them. From the cloud a voice said, "This is my own dear Son, and I am pleased with him. Listen to what he says!" When the disciples heard the voice, they were so afraid that they fell flat on the ground. But Jesus came over and touched them. He said, "Get up and don't be afraid." When they opened their eyes, the saw only Jesus.

ACCEPTANCE



PPP is a more structured approach to behaviour management and goes over some strategies to use in the moment as well as planning ahead and boundary setting. It focuses more on dealing with the behaviours.

COSP is an attachment based program that focuses more on responding (not reacting!) to our children's needs in a firm but very kind and gentle way. It encourages us as parents to explore why we may feel uncomfortable with some of our children's

behaviours or emotions and how we can catch ourselves to then respond in a different way.





PLEASE NOTE: Applicants must have a current WA driver's licence and use of a motorised vehicle. Applicants will be required to complete a health assessment, integrity and criminal check, training and if successful, will also be required to apply for a 'Working with Children' card.

a health assessment will be reimbursed after working one month.

Keep Watch Toddler Drowning Prevention Program is coming to Kalgoorlie!

What is the Keep Watch Program?

Keep Watch is a health promotion program coordinated by Royal Life Saving WA. The program educates parents and carers of young children about toddler drowning risks and prevention strategies.

Drowning is the leading cause of preventable death in children under 5 years of age in Australia. On average, 4 toddlers fatally drown in WA and another 50 are admitted to hospital following a non-fatal drowning incident. Keep Watch aims to prevent these accidents by reminding parents of simple things that they can do around the home to prevent drowning.



What services are available in Kalgoorlie?

RLSSWA is supported by the WA Department of Health to provide toddler drowning prevention education to parents across WA. We have a staff member travelling to Kalgoorlie on <u>29th and</u> <u>30th March</u> and it would be great to work with you to get drowning prevention messages to parents.

Parent presentations are available for early parenting groups, playgroups, family centres and parent support organisations. This presentation is for parents to learn more about why toddlers are at risk of drowning and how to keep kids safe. A demonstration of CPR is also included. Parent presentations run for approximately 45 mins and are free of charge.
