MANDATE LETTER - NEW EVANGELISATION IN OUR SCHOOL

For new evangelisation, initiatory catechesis must be offered to young people in ways that draw out the Christian Promise. The 'nucleus of Christian experience', along with the most fundamental beliefs and the most basic evangelical values needed to enter into this experience, are preserved in the four pillars of faith that provide the structure of the Catechism of the Catholic Church: the Apostles' creed, the sacraments, the Life in Christ and the Lord's Prayer.

Yesterday was Ash Wednesday and many Christians received a cross of ashes on their foreheads. This powerful sign has been used by God's people for hundreds of years. The cross of ashes tells friends and neighbours that we know we are not perfect.

We sometimes break the law of God. We hurt other people. We act selfishly.

Today we tell God and each other that we are sorry. With the help of Jesus, we will try to become better during the forty days of Lent. The cross of ashes means all of these things. During Lent we try to pray more often, to listen to God's word with special care, and to become more generous and thoughtful towards each other at school, and in our families. Lent is a time when we remember those in need.

EXCLUSIVE BETHANY HIATT

A public primary school in Perth's south where threequarters of students come from a non-English speaking background has been named one of WA's best-performing schools based on national reading, writing and maths tests.

Caladenia Primary School in Canning Vale is among 20 schools in WA to be singled out for its NAPLAN achievements in a list compiled by the Austra-lian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority. From today, parents will be

able to see how their child's school performed on NAPLAN tests held last year when the My School website is updated. To coincide with the update,

ACARA has identified "high-performing" primary and sec-ondary schools in each State which are punching above their weight. The list — which excludes selective schools -- is based on each school's performance in the past three years relative to their level of socio-

educational advantage. WA's list includes 14 public schools, five independent of which four are schools Islamic colleges - and just one Catholic school.

ACARA also released a list of the top-three performing schools by area which highlight stellar performances by schools in city and country regions.

District High School. About 1.2 million students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 were tested on their reading, numeracy, writing, spelling and grammar and punctuation in May last year, with parents receiving their children's individual reports in September.

The My School website colour codes each school's average NAPLAN results depending on how they performed when com-pared with students from similar backgrounds.

Green cells show that students at that school performed significantly above all other students across the nation with a similar level of socio-educational advantage.

Every school in Australia has a government-assigned index of community socio-educational advantage — or ICSEA score — determined by parents' determined by parents' occupations, levels of education and the school's geographical location.

The top-20 list was based on the percentage of green cells highlighted for each school from 2019 to 2022.

ACARA chief executive David de Carvalho said the information on the My School website helped parents, schools and governments to understand schools' performance.

"It also provides teachers with important insights into school performance, support-ing and driving improvements across the nation," he said.

Ted Nastasi. principal of Caladenia which the Education

Department named primary school of the year in 2019, said its teachers expected all students to achieve to the best of their abilities.

'Great results are the product of years of building a strong and nurturing school culture,' he said.

About 77 per cent of the school's 900 students come from a non-English speaking background, with more than 60 languages spoken bv its families.

The school has a strong music program and runs a "multiage academic class" where students with extended learning capacities can work together.

"Our success is built on encouraging 'best practice' teaching and learning in all

classes by modifying and adapting explicit teaching principles," Mr Nastasi said.

"In 2023, 18 students from our Year 6 cohort were accepted into (academically selective) Modern special programs, which is a phenomenal result.

Abdullah Khan, executive principal of Australian Islamic College which has campuses in Thornlie, Dianella and Kew-dale, said he was "excited" to learn they had all made the list. "It will increase the staff morale and students' commit-

ment," he said. Mr Khan said NAPLAN results had improved signifisince the schools focusing on explicit cantly began instruction.

ACCEPTANCE



PPP is a more structured approach to behaviour management and goes over some strategies to use in the moment as well as planning ahead and boundary setting. It focuses more on dealing with the behaviours.

COSP is an attachment based program that focuses more on responding (not reacting!) to our children's needs in a firm but very kind and gentle way. It encourages us as parents to explore why we may feel uncomfortable with some of our children's

behaviours or emotions and how we can catch ourselves to then respond in a different way.







In order to keep our children as safe as possible and ease the parking congestion, can all parents please follow these parking guidelines.

School Pick up lanes

Front Lane

- Queue at the front of the school through the gates to the kiss and go lane.
- Do not queue into Maritana St. Go around the block and try again.
- You cannot pick your children up at the front of the school. They must wait for you at the pick-up lane.
- Keep the line moving. Your children will be directed to your car.
- Do not park and leave your car in the pick-up lane.

Back Lane

- First three children will be directed to your car and then everyone will move up.
- Remind children to go straight to the pick-up lane so as not to hold up the process.
- Do not park and leave your car in the pick-up lane

Mud map of Carpark.

- Please note the No Parking along the front and back of the carpark to allow movement of cars.
- Note the entry and the one-way direction to travel to your parking space and then to travel to the exit.
- Use the walkway and gate near the sports shed. Keep children near you when walking to and from your car.
- Be patient, everyone will get used to using the carpark.
