MANDATE LETTER - A SCHOOL CULTURE OF INITIATORY CATECHESIS

Yet while students need family and parish catechesis, in reality many young people today receive little, if any, apprenticeship in the faith in their families and parishes. This is particularly true where families do not take part in parish life. This makes it essential for the Catholic school to do all that it can to provide initiatory catechesis—even through schools can never substitute for the initiatory catechesis young people need from their families and parishes.

On Friday 17 March, we remember Saint Patrick, the patron of Ireland. Patrick was actually British. He was kidnapped as a teenager and bought to Ireland as a slave. Later he escaped, returned to his family and his studies and became a priest. Years later he returned to Ireland as a missionary and bishop. By the time Patrick died in 461, a great many Irish families had turned to Christ. Many Irish people came to Australia in the nineteenth century and helped the church to grow. The closing for today is part of a long poem he may have written.

GOSPEL

Listen to the words of the Holy Gospel according to Luke 10:1-9

The Lord chose seventy-two followers and sent them out two by two to every town and village where he was about to go. He said to them, "A large crop is in the fields, but there are only a few workers. Ask the Lord in charge of the harvest to send out workers to bring it in.

"Now go, but remember, I am sending you like lambs into a pack of wolves. Don't take along a moneybag or a travelling bag or sandals. As soon as you enter a home, say, 'God bless this home with peace.' If the people living there are peace-loving, your prayer for peace will return to you. Stay with the same family, eating and drinking whatever they give you, because workers are worth what they earn.

'If the people of a town welcome you, eat whatever they offer. Heal their sick and say, "God's kingdom will soon be here!"





ACCEPTANCE

 \overline{PPP} is a more structured approach to behaviour management and goes over some strategies to use in the moment as well as planning ahead and boundary setting. It focuses more on dealing with the behaviours.

COSP is an attachment based program that focuses more on responding (not reacting!) to our children's needs in a firm but very kind and gentle way. It encourages us as parents to explore why we may feel uncomfortable with some of our children's

behaviours or emotions and how we can catch ourselves to then respond in a different way.

Standard Children's Crossing Hours: 1 hour in morning and 1 hour in afternoon


Hourly Rate: \$25.90 per hour, which includes 20% loading in lieu of payment for public

PLEASE NOTE: Applicants must have a current WA driver's licence and use of a motorised vehicle. Applicants will be required to complete a health assessment, integrity and criminal check, training and if successful, will also be required to apply for a 'Working with Children' card.

The cost of the Working with Children Card and up to \$70 towards a health assessment will be reimbursed after working one month.
