MANDATE LETTER- The Distinctive Ethos of the Catholic School

The second basic requirement for the ethos of a school to be 'Catholic" is the commitment of community members to the Christian vision of the student as a person. This is a shared vision of whom gad is calling students to become, as revealed by Jesus Christ. He is the model the school presents to students. His teachings and values of his Gospel are the educational norms that need to permeate the school's entire curriculum and life.

On Saturday we celebrate the International Day for World Peace. This was established by the United Nations in 1982. It is a day when individuals, communities, nations and governments highlight efforts to end conflict and promote peace. Many groups keep a 24-hour vigil on this day to pray for peace in our homes, in our communities and between nations.

On Sunday we continue to read from the Gospel of Mark. The disciples are arguing about which one of them is the greatest. Jesus teaches them that their jealousy of each other means that they are thinking only of themselves. Faith in Jesus means that they must think of others. In today's reading Jesus promises that when we welcome and care for anyone, we are welcoming God in our midst.

Listen to the words of the Holy Gospel according to Mark: 9:33-37

Jesus and his disciples went to his home in Capernaum. After they inside the house, Jesus asked them, "What were you arguing about along the way?" They had been arguing about which one of them was the greatest, and so they did not answer.

After Jesus sat down and told the twelve disciples to gather around him, he said, "If you want the place of honour, you must become a slave and serve others!"

Then Jesus had a child stand near him. He put his arm around the child and said, 'When you welcome even a child because of me, you welcome me. And when you welcome me, you welcome the one who sent me."




