### <u>Reading</u>

Today's reading from the Sunday Gospel is another of the stories that Jesus told. It is a favourite of Christians everywhere, so you may know it by heart. It is usually called the Parable of the Prodigal Son. Listen again to the story of the wasteful son and his forgiving father.



#### Listen to the words of the Holy Gospel according to Luke: 15:11-24

Jesus told this story: Once a man had two sons. The younger son said to his father, "Give me my share of the property." So, the father divided his property between his two sons. The younger son packed up everything he owned and left for a foreign country. He had spent everything when a bad famine spread through that whole land. 
