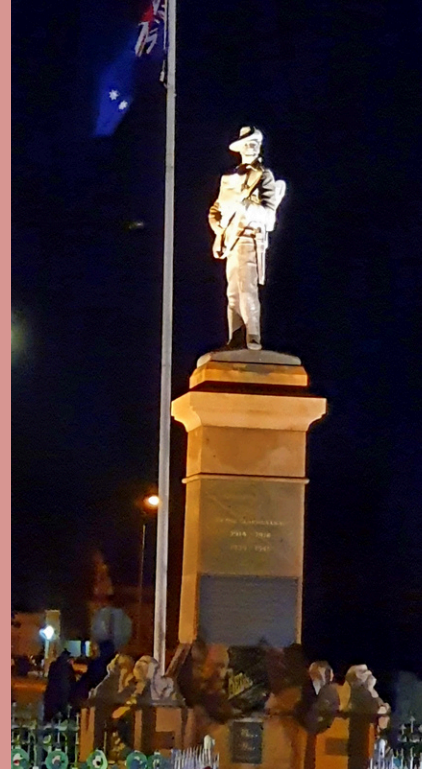

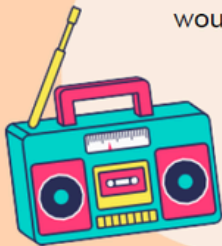
To help enhance the learning of our students we are reaching out to our wonderful community for donations of any 'old' technology you may have laying around at home or work.
